## Welcome to Founder's Day!

The founders were all strong, dynamic women with a vision for the future, but we thought we'd try a little different focus for this year. Why did these women choose to make their marks by founding DKG? The early years of the 20th century were rife with causes they could have chosen: women's suffrage, women's legal status, women's health, child labor.....but they chose to found an organization to advance the professional and personal growth of women educators and excellence in education. Why? Of course we don't have anything in their own words but here are some of the results we found in our research.

Let's start with a quote from 1849 by the Littleton School Committee, of Littleton, MA:

"God seems to have made a woman peculiarly suited to guide and develop the infant mind, and it seems...very poor policy to pay a man 20 or 22 dollars a month, for teaching children the ABCs, when a female could do the work more successfully at one-third of the price."

It seems pretty obvious that their primary thought was saving money. School boards don't seem to change much over the years......

The International Leadership Training will be PRIOR to the International Conference in New Orleans from July 29-August 2, 2025. More information will

Our Keynote Speaker during lunch was Margot Lee Shetterly, the author of <u>Hidden Figures: The American Dream and the Untold Story of the Black</u> <u>Women Mathematicians Who Helped Win the Space Race</u>. She was a great speaker and continues to search for hidden truths.

The entire General Session Three was voting to approve or not approve proposed amendments.

In between everything, I attended two Spotlight Sessions. More on the Spotlight Sessions I attended will come at a later time.

Thursday was Day 3. It opened with Regional Breakfasts. We are in the SW Region.

General Session 4 was voting on proposed amendments. 692 voting members I did attend two Topic Talks - Fundraising and Teamwork.

I also attended a Spotlight Session on Revitalization presented by Becky Sadowski - Chair and past International President. I am still going through the notes I took.

Toward the closing of the day, I went to a Spotlight Session that explained the DKG International Educators Foundation. This foundation is <u>very</u> busy!

During General Session 5, the final amendments were voted on (signed, sealed and delivered!!!!).

Our Keynote Speaker during lunch was Andre Bradford, an Austin-based slam poet. What is a slam poet, you ask? I had no idea at the start and I am not too sure I know much more now.

The best part of the day was attending a Spotlight Session on AI-Powered Education. One important thing I learned about myself is that I am way behind the 8-ball concerning technology in the classroom. There can be great bene-

fits and also major downsides. I wish we had had about 2 hours more time to talk about how it is used from teachers already incorporating it in their class-rooms.

I also attended a Spotlight Session on EEC.

The end of the day was both sobering and inspiring. Marion Blumenthall Lazan, a DKG International Honorary Member, spoke of her life from a concentration camp in Germany during WWII to becoming an Instrument of Peace. She speaks to students and adults across the US and Europe, advocating for tolerance and respect whenever she addresses her audience. It is a message of perseverance, determination, faith, and hope. I feel honored to have had the chance to attend one of her inspirational talks.

I did not attend Saturday, but Judy Merz kept me informed of events.

I returned home to a storm! The plane was actually told to circle the airport until the storm started to clear off. THEN.....when we got the OK to land, the planes were too close so we had to go around again. Needless to say, the passengers applauded when we touched down.
